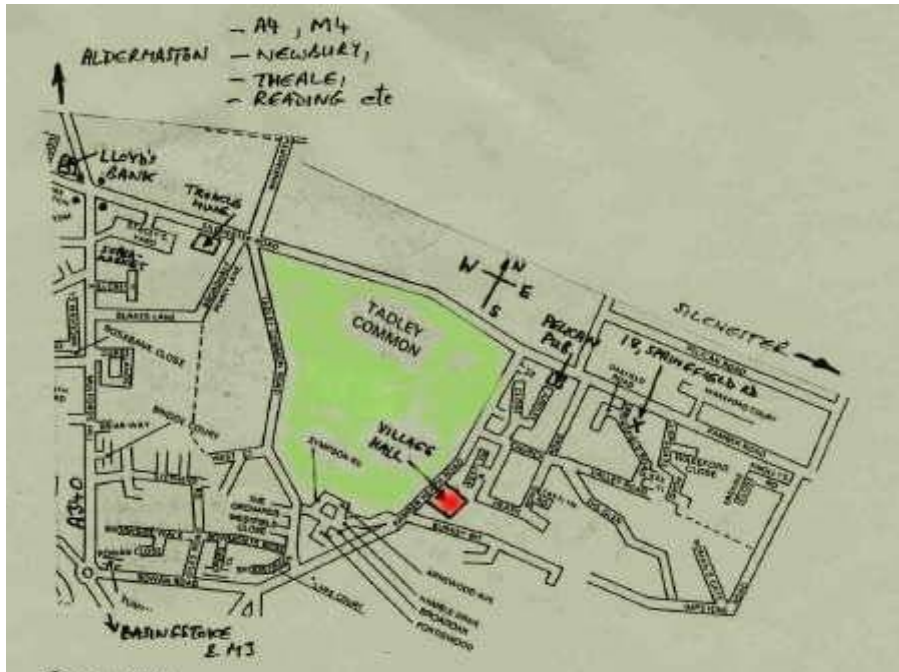


SOUTH EASTERN PYRENEAN MOUNTAIN DOG CLUB

All judges at this show agree to abide by the following statement:

“In assessing dogs, judges must penalise any feature or exaggerations
which they consider would be detrimental to the soundness, health and
well being of the dog.”

12. **BEST IN SHOW** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Withdrawal from Other Competition—Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes and Best of Breed, prior to the Competition for Best in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The Dog declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten is Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team, or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to the Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that the exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not having been completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.

14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by an advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17. The Committee will be empowered to exclude, or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from illness, disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place either before or after judging the entry fee will be forfeited.

18. It should be distinctly understood by exhibitors and purchasers of dogs at the Show and all other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of, or damage to dogs or any other property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others. It is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.

19. Should the Judge be prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge or Judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.

20. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance.

21. Should any question arise which is not provided for in these regulations the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject to appeal to the Kennel Club.

22. Any cost incurred from dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the exhibitor concerned.

23. All exhibitors are reminded that any dog present at the Show must be entered either in a class or not for competition. (Puppies over 5 months of age may be entered NFC). All dogs must be under control. Any dog deemed to be aggressive and out of control may be subject to exclusion from future shows.

24. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not a Challenge Certificate or 4 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

VETERAN: For all dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the first day of the show.

BRACE: For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in a class other than Brace or Team.

KENNEL CLUB BREEDERS COMPETITION: Any 4 dogs with the same breeder(s). (A record book **must** be purchased from the K. C.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at **09.00 a.m.**
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at **10.00 a.m. PROMPT.**
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed.
5. The use of cooking Stoves is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry Fees: Members First Entry with each dog £10.00; Non-members First Entry with each dog £12.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog is £1.00. Not for competition £1.00. Membership £9.00 Joint, £8.00 Single, 50p Junior. Catalogues: Ordered and paid with entry £2.00. On the day £2.50
7. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
8. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW** - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy, it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best in Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will automatically be Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group and Best in Show respectively.

Withdrawal from Competition - Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition for Best puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten is Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team, or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

(The word “Dog” includes both sexes.) Puppies under 6 calendar months are not eligible for entry at this show. In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which counts towards the title of Champion shall be 5 point green stars or more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries i.e. 4th March 2012, shall be counted when entering for a class. Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering in Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A Variety Class is one in which more than one breed or variety of a breed can compete. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options.

(1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.

(2) Transfer

(a) If a dog is ineligible for the class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight, height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight and height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class or Puppy Class, which is over age, but under 12 calendar months of age or 18 calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class or Junior Class respectively to the correct breed, colour, sex, weight & height or in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class respectively to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight and height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight and height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if this is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

NOTE: No dog is eligible for entry at a limited show which has won a Challenge Certificate or obtained an award which counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club (N.B. Reserve CCs do not make a dog ineligible)

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First prize at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy or Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 3 or more First Prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy or Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

UNDERGRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 3 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Please tick the box if you do NOT wish to have your name & address printed in the Catalogue.

Please tick the box if you do NOT wish to have photographs taken of your dog.

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade—take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

DOG FOULING: Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to clear up any fouling by their dogs. There will be a marked exercise area so please make use of it. Failure to clear up when requested to do so will be reported to the Kennel Club.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (ANNEX B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition at a Show. When a dog is found to have been prepared for exhibition at a show in contravention of these regulations the exhibitor will be dealt with as if a complaint under Kennel Club Rule 42 has been lodged against them and proved to the satisfaction of the General Committee without prejudice to the right of the exhibitor to make representations to the General Committee in mitigation of the penalty to be imposed at the discretion of the General Committee under Rule 42. The dog will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the Show and from any award gained thereat.
2. No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be used in preparation of a dog for exhibition either before or at the Show. Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat of a dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing may be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive except -
 - A) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - B) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - C) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds.
 - D) Operations to prevent breeding providing that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the person who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

An objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
